## Manufacturing Sector

### Myanma Awba opens new agrochemical production complex in Yangon

Myanmar Awba Group, Myanmar's largest manufacturer and distributor of agricultural technology, launched Myanmar's first private agrochemical production complex in Yangon Region on August 19. The US\$35 million Hmawbi Agricultural Input Complex (HAIC) is located near Wa Nat Cyaung Village in Hmawbi Township, occupying 126 acres of land. Myanma Awba is providing up to \$25 million to finance the HAIC, while the remaining funds have been provided by the International Finance Corporation (IFC).

HAIC will manufacture more than 200 proprietary agrochemical blends which it will distribute at an affordable price to local farmers. This will reduce the cost of production per acre for each farmer. Based on his estimates, a local production plant can help to reduce farmers' costs up to 20 percent and raise competitiveness. By 2021, HAIC expects to supply around half of Myanmar's agrochemical demands.

HAIC is aiming to manufacture 3.3 million-10.3 million liters of insecticides, fungicides and herbicides in concentrate form within the next four years. It will also manufacture 1.7 million-5 million kilograms in powder form. Myanma Awba is planning to utilise solar power and greenhouse technology to manage its own production costs and power consumption needs.

The company was established in 1995 and now serves 3.5 million farming families. It also provides microfinance, digitization and logistics services.

### The first Thailand-owned plastics industry opened in Thilawa

The very first Thailand-owned plastics industry which worth USD 12 million was opened in Thilawa SEZ on 20<sup>th</sup> August with the aim to develop plastics manufacturing industry in Myanmar. The company is joint venture between S.P Petpack Inter Group Myanmar and PTT Global Chemical Public Company. The industry will manufacture quality plastic products which meet international standard by using high-end technology.

## Trading

### No more sugar re-export licenses: Ministry of Commerce

The government will temporarily stop issuing sugar re-export licenses in anticipation of the local sugar cane season, according to a senior official from the Ministry of Commerce.

Issuing of re-export licenses will continue until September 22, after which the government would no longer issue re-export licenses, according to the Directorate of Trade under Ministry of Commerce.

But sugar industry players said the September 22 cutoff date is already late as there is an existing glut in the market. Sugar warehouses in Yangon, Mandalay and Muse have abundant stocks of the commodity, with an estimated surplus of 300,000 tonnes. The current price of sugar has fell to K660,000 per tonne compared with the K850,000 per tonne before sugar imported from foreign countries through the re-export system flooded the local market.

## Service Sector

### Ooredoo invests US\$2.4 billion within four-year period

Ooredoo Myanmar has invested US\$2.4 billion within a four-year period until at the end of 2018 in Myanmar, said its CEO Vikram Sinha during a ceremony to mark fourth anniversary of Ooredoo in Myanmar held on August 14.

Ooredoo Myanmar set up its business in Myanmar at the end of 2013 through US\$1.3 billion investment and started their services in 2014. It had spent about US\$6 million for corporate social responsibilities (CSR) for the interest and betterment of Myanmar people. They implemented the CSR programs especially in education and health care sectors.

The Ooredoo Myanmar is now planning to introduce 5G technology and start implementation process. It tested 4G Pro networks as a pilot project in Mandalay and with a download speed up to 500 MB/s. It is still being implemented in Yangon too, sources said.

## **My Tel launches FTTH service**

My Tel rolled out FTTH service for SMEs and households on 15th August. It offers 3 kinds of monthly package:

- Speed 5Mbps+2Mbps (Bonus) with 49,000 MMK,
- Speed 10 Mbps+4Mbps (Bonus) with 89,000 MMK,
- Speed 15 Mbps+6Mbps (Bonus) 122,000 MMK.

Bonus bandwidth plan is valid to till September 22nd. According to My Tel website, 6-month subscribers will not need to pay initial installation fee. For 1-year subscribers, they can enjoy not only free installation fee but also additional one-month bonus. My Tel has 24 hour customer service hotline for its customers, and that service is only available in Yangon area for the moment. The company has a plan to extend such kind of customer service to other State and Regions.

## **Gold, jewellery IMEX OSSC to be opened**

One Stop Service Centre (OSSC) regarding gold and related jewellery import/export will be opened at Culture Valley in People's Park, Yangon, on 3 September. The OSSC includes an appraising team and related departments. After the Ministry of Commerce announced import and export permit of gold and related jewellery products on 22 January, preparations were made for an OSSC to be opened. Gold export and import might vary depending on current supply and demand. According to current market condition, gold import will possibly well.

Traders are currently focusing on import. Most of the gold entrepreneurs expressed their interest in import. However, only 1-2kg of gold will be initially imported. If everything turns out well, all members of Yangon Region Gold Entrepreneurs Association are likely to start importing gold, said U Myo Myint, chair of this association.

## **Grand Mercure announces first Myanmar property opening**

French hotel chain Grand Mercure has announced the opening of its first property in Myanmar, in the commercial capital of Yangon.

According to an industry report, the Grand Mercure Yangon Golden Empire has 175 rooms, ranging in size from 30 square metre rooms to 340 sqm suites. The new property, which is located in South Okkalapa Township, will also host a restaurant, deli, a pool bar and two ballrooms that can host up to 400 guests, the report in BWhotelier.com said.

Earlier this year, the luxury Excelsior Hotel opened in Yangon, while American hotelier Rosewood is expected to open a large-scale hotel overlooking Yangon River within the coming months.



## **MNA suffers over Ks-18 billion in loss in three years**

Myanmar National Airlines (MNA) suffers a loss of over Ks-18 billion during three fiscal years after the transformation into the company, according to the report by the Joint Public Account Committee findings on the Union Auditor-General's finding report and comment for 2016-2017 FY.

The MNA, which started its operations outside of the Union fund since 2013-2014 FY, has to take over the Myanmar Airways' money as well as moveable and immovable properties and salaries of retired staffs that moved to other departments. There was a loss of Ks-8.962 billion in 2015-2016 FY, Ks-5.695 billion in 2016-2017 FY and Ks-3.401 billion in 2017-2018 FY.

The MNA still suffer losses but the rate of losses are declining. Currently, the MNA is offering domestic flight services to 27 towns and oversea flight schedules by 15 flights. According to CEO Capt. Than Tun, MNA has to pay over US\$ 4.3 mil a month for aircraft rental fees and instalment payment. If the state invests to buy aircrafts, loss will be reduced and MNA would support state budget. MNA currently stands third position in highest occupancy rate airlines among 28 airlines which operate in Myanmar.

## **Amata Holding Public Co begins share sales**

Amata Holding Public Company Ltd doing business mainly in hotel and tourism industry has started selling shares worth K2 million to public members.

Share sales were held at Sedona Hotel in Yangon on August 26. The company is due to sell shares not only to Myanmar citizens but also to foreigners, said company chairman Win Aung.

One share of Amata Holding Co is worth K5, 000. Now, sale of shares worth K2 million has started, and up to shares worth K10 billion will be sold.

Those shares of Amata Holding Public Company are being sold at KBZ Stirling Coleman Securities Company, Myanmar Securities Exchange Centre Company, AYA Trust Securities Company, CB Securities Company and Amara Investment Securities Company from August 13 to September 12. The company aims to become YSX listed company in 2019.

## **Legislation**

### **Additional service charges will be added to commercial taxes: IRD**

Internal Revenue Department on August 13 issued an announcement that hotels, guest houses and restaurants will collect bottle charges, room service charges and service charges in addition to the commercial taxes levied on accommodation and foods.

Apart from goods and services exempted under the Union Tax Law, commercial taxes will be levied on all goods and services.



They will have to collect these charges in accordance with the Commercial Tax Law. The IRD has warned that the IRD will fine those who fail to affix the commercial tax stamps on vouchers in accord with Section 21 (f) of the Commercial Tax Law.

### **Licences to be revoked if importers fail to settle violation within 30 days**

Twenty-nine automobile companies from Yangon, Mandalay and Nay Pyi Taw are warned by the Supervisory Committee for Motor Vehicle Import for violating rules, and are urged to settle their violation within 30 days. The supervisory committee conducted an inspection tour to check whether or not car sales centers abided by the prescribed rules and regulation. They found 29 companies violating the rules. Those companies are urged to settle their violations within 30 days to the supervisory committee, which regulates vehicle registrations, imports and taxation. If those companies fail to settle this, the import licenses of companies' directors will be revoked and company registration will be cancelled. The Supervisory Committee for Motor Vehicle Import released an official announcement on 16 October 2017 to the effect that the year 2014 would be set as the limit for the oldest models that can be imported in 2018. Only vehicles with left-hand drive are allowed to be imported, under the new policy.

### **Livestock insurance to be launched by year-end**

Myanmar will launch an insurance policy covering livestock insurance for the first time in 30 years. State-owned Myanma Insurance, the Department of Livestock Breeding and Veterinary under the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation (MOALI), Singapore-based InfoCorp Technologies and Myanmar's RGK+Z&A Group are cooperating to launch the livestock insurance pilot project, which will be supported by the bank. The insurance application process will involve registration of the livestock using InfoCorp Technologies' tamper-proof livestock identification tagging technology. This involves inserting a digital chip into each animal.

The registration fee per head of cattle is estimated to be around US\$2. There is also a premium rate of about 1pc of value of the livestock. By insuring their cattle and livestock, breeders will stand a better chance of receiving loans from the bank to grow their herd. This is because they will be able to use the animals as collateral.

### **Ministry to check quality of fuel and lubricating oils starting September**

The ministry is planning to check the quality of fuel and lubricating oils every time they are imported, starting from September and will only be allowed to distribute in the market if only they have the right quality, according to Ministry of Electricity and Energy.



Myanmar Petroleum Product Enterprise (MPPE) under the ministry only took the sample the first time to check the quality of oil and lubricants. The MPPE will be checked the quality of oil and lubricants every time now as long as they are being imported starting from September. It said the plan for quality control is a bid to gain more trust from the customers in the market.

## **Economy**

### **UMFCCI to report suggestions from 2<sup>nd</sup> B4B Insights Forum to government**

A two-day 2nd B4B Insights Forum hosted by UMFCCI held on 25 and 26 August discussed matters from various sectors; tourism, logistic service, industrial enterprises, motor vehicle business, food chain, garment business on Cutting-Making and Packaging basis, power supply and distribution, health, information technology, exchange rate. Additionally, experts also discussed existing laws, by-laws and policies. Forum mainly highlights on current economic climate and meeting outcome is aimed to bring about benefits for both public and private sector.

Moreover, the findings of Myanmar Business Sentiment Survey jointly conducted by Private Sector Development Committee, Myanmar Marketing Research and Development Limited (MMRD) and UMFCCI were also explained by U Moe Kyaw, chairman of MMRD at the 2nd B4B Insights Forum. This year, 2nd Quarter Business Sentiment Survey was collected from a total of 2,535 businessmen. Those enterprises which answered the survey are engaged in manufacturing, service and export/import sectors.

Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry (UMFCCI) will also submit the suggestions report resulted from the 2nd Quarter B4B Insights Forum to the government, according to UMFCCI.

### **Sean Turnell speech on Myanmar Economy**

Amid criticism of the government from the business community over sluggish growth and a lack of economic direction, Mr. Sean Turnell, the economic adviser to Myanmar State Counselor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, addressed about Myanmar economy in “Myanmar’s Economy 2018: progress, problems, possibilities” seminar.

According to him, the main problems include bureaucratic sclerosis across government departments, the current account deficit, and structural problems in the banking system, weak infrastructure, the crisis in Rakhine State and global economic uncertainty due to the U.S.-China trade war.

As for economic progress, he highlighted that most macroeconomic indicators are stable and headed in the right direction, citing examples such as continued annual gross domestic product (GDP) growth, the inclusion of more people in the financial system, a stable inflation rate and decreased reliance on the practice of printing money to pay down budget deficits.



Although UMFCCI short-term business sentiment survey highlighted a decline in business confidence, Turnell pointed that the Myanmar Sustainable Development Plan (MSDP) is on the way, which will give the economy a fiscal boost and liberalize key sectors, particularly the financial sector, to stimulate economic growth. As another example of NLD government's economic achievements, he cited the fact that the renewal of the China-backed Kyauk Phyu project agreement had not resulted in Myanmar owing a single dollar to China.

### **Myanmar, Thailand ink agreements on airlines, shrimp breeding**

Myanmar and Thailand yesterday signed several agreements which further cemented ties between the two countries. These included a bilateral airline agreement, inked at the Myanmar Foreign Minister's office, as well as a second agreement to improve an existing shrimp breeding zone with the aim of facilitating development in Rakhine State.

The airline agreement will replace the existing agreement, which was inked in 1969. In the new agreement, rules governing the aviation sector, including airlines and airline service providers were amended or included.

Thailand also committed to providing financial assistance for the development of Rakhine State. It will also provide B34 million to assist in the upgrading of the Yay Chan Pyin shrimp breeding zone in Rakhine. With yields expected to improve by incorporating modern farming techniques, the government hopes the shrimp produced can also serve as food and nutrition for local residents.

### **Yangon, South Korean firm ink industrial agreement**

The Yangon regional government signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Myanmar Wooree Co, a South Korean firm, to establish an industrial project on July 11. The regional government plans to construct this industrial project on the western side of Yangon River and will plan to connect that with the proposed Dala Bridge, located in Dala township. Based on the study, different parties will determine the site area, types of investment and other details. Korean investors are highly interested to invest in Dala Township.

The MOU is merely the first step. Wooree is required to undertake a feasibility study. It will also be required to undertake an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), which is legally required by Myanmar law.

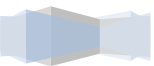
